- According to the American Association of People with Disabilities (AAPD), transportation
 continues to play an integral role in equitable civil rights and mobility for people with
 disabilities (AAPD, 2012).
- The AAPD report cites that of the nearly 2 million people with disabilities in this country who never leave their homes, 560,000 do so because of lack of transportation.
- Specifically looking at transportation issues following a disaster, it's important to consider the following:



- Do people with disabilities still have access to public transit?
- Do people with disabilities still have access to paratransit (accessible transit available for scheduling and door-to-door service)?
- Are the bus lines interrupted?
- Are the interruptions temporary or permanent?
- What are the alternative options?

 - Does the person live near a bus line or is the line accessible (how long is it to travel to the bus stop?)
 - Does the person know how to access public transit?
